5. Notes from Head Teacher	Buildings Update	There may be an issue with the siting of the new classroom due to an Oak Tree with a preservation order. It may be necessary to re-consider where the classroom goes. The Trim-trail is in place, although not completed due to poor	
		weather. It is currently fenced off. Q. Are you going to make this public through the media? A. I would prefer not to in order to deter unwanted visitors. Q. Have there been any problems recently with unwanted intrusions? A. None recently.	
		The staff toilets have been upgraded.	
	SEN	There are currently 56 out of 274 children with SEN i.e. approximately 20%. Only 7 have an EHC. No additional funding is received for the other 49 children. However, we do provide extra support for the majority of these children. The average number of SEN children in any school is 14%. Q. Are we developing an SEN specialism?	

	Addendum to data Other matters	A. We are good at it and definitely the school of choice, which is a positive reflection on the school. The errors have been corrected and the SLT will discuss how we assess writing in future at the meeting tomorrow. The middle table which shows 57% for non-SEN children would improve if we were to re-assess it today based on a less rigid method of assessment. Q. Will it cause problems in data if we ease off? A. No, although it did when Ofsted were here. Q. Surely there is nothing wrong with aiming high? A. We have been too harsh in assessment. Spelling is an issue If we can prove they can spell it correctly once in a test – then it is okay. An extended time application for SATs has been made for 5-6 children. A defribulator is to be sited in the reception area. The website is to be updated with no cost in order to make it more tablet/ IPAD friendly
