On Friday 5<sup>th</sup> November all the pupils in school took part in some exciting activities to learn all about climate change. The school council members had played a big part in designing the activities for this day and they chose to call it 'Earth Day'. The children learnt about COP26, climate change, global warming and took part in an activity in association with the WWF. The children thought carefully about ways to save our planet and then wrote a promise on a leaf. The leaves were shared with the WWF who put the leaves together with those of other pupils from around the world to create a global forest of promises that were then shared with world leaders at the recent COP26 summit. Fantastic job everybody!

### Oak Tree

A big thank you to Charlie in Owls class and his grandparents who kindly donated an oak tree which they had grown from an acorn. Mr Thorpe agreed to plant the tree for us (as he is a landscape gardener and knows what he's doing and it was heavy!). We planted it on 'Earth Day' as a way to help offset our carbon footprint. It has been planted at a safe distance from our other protected trees.

The children in Ducks, Robins, Woodpeckers and Kingfishers classes all enjoyed their "Make, Bake and Shake Day". The day saw all children join in with making jam, baking bread and shaking cream to turn it into butter - they were amazed at how the consistency changed. 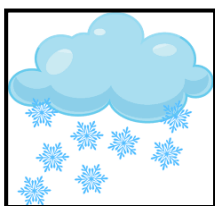
### KS1 Christmas Party

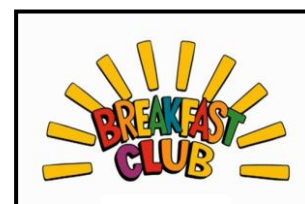

## Breakfast Club

Parents / carers **MUST** book Breakfast Club sessions in advance via Parentmail to guarantee their child's place; spaces will be booked on a first-come-first served basis. Breakfast Club opens at 8.00am and is currently open with a *limited* number of places, therefore please only book your child into Breakfast Club if you have no other alternative.



Please let the school office know if you need breakfast club and we will add the booking option to your Parentmail account. Currently, the system only allows booking for one week at a time, and the sessions go live every Monday. The sessions close on Thursday lunchtime, or until the sessions are fully booked. The cost of each session remains £2.00 (children entitled to Free School Meals will not need to pay) and **ALL** sessions must be booked in advance, regardless whether they are chargeable or not.

## Attendance and Punctuality

Last term, our whole school attendance was **95.55%**, our target is 97% (the national level). We need to remember, for our school to reach 97% we need to ensure that children's time out of school is only for illness or **exceptional circumstances**.

Lateness also needs to be considered as 'on time to school' really does matter; school doors open at 8.45am and school learning begins at 8.55am.

### Reminder: parking / access



Whilst we appreciate the difficulties regarding the limited parking options, in order to keep the access to school clear for emergency services (at all times) and for the safeguarding and well-being of children being brought into school and collected by taxi, **please DO NOT park in the yellow boxed area or block the car parking spaces outside the staff car park.**

We have also been contacted by our neighbours in Back Lane – please can we request parents/carers are mindful of where they are parking and to be respectful of our local community.

When dropping off and collecting children from Key Stage 2 playground, please can we remind parents and carers to keep the slope to the playground clear - it is becoming congested and difficult for children and classes to pass through. You may use any of the available space on the playground.
