
Curriculum News

Owls and Herons



Welcome back to a new school year! This term's topic is 'Anglo-Saxon Britain'. The children will be exploring who the Anglo-Saxons were and how we know what was important to them.

Overview

Literacy

Children will be reading texts from different genres, writing both descriptive, narrative and information texts and building on their grammar skills. Owls will be trialling a new Literacy format this term.
