PCSO workshop – Y5/6 Scam Awareness



The children in UKS2 took part in a Scam awareness workshop, once again run by PCSO Emma. They identified different ways that people might get scammed and had to think about whether only old people get scammed. The children learnt that anyone could be a scam victim no matter how old they are or how much money they have. They learnt that millions of people in the UK get tricked by scams and the reasons behind this. The children watched a very informative video about how they could possibly get scammed on social media, which brought out some quite lively discussions! The session finished with top tips to protect themselves and others about scams. The children got a lot out of this workshop and thoroughly enjoyed it.

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
Y6 Church Festival



Recently, our Y6 pupils travelled to Lincoln Cathedral to join the Y6 Church Schools Leavers' Festival, which is held annually.

Over a seven day period, 70 church schools and over 2,000 pupils from the Lincoln Diocese engage in this special event.

The day is a celebration of the children's time at primary school and an opportunity to wish them well for their future education. Children enjoyed a guided tour of the cathedral, explored the Education Centre, and joined in with a celebratory act of worship.



Y6 Bikeability



Last term, some of our Year 6 pupils took part in Bikeability training. This is a course which teaches the children about road safety whilst riding their bikes. The children thoroughly enjoyed their sessions and the instructors commented on their fabulous manners and good listening skills; well done Year 6!

Sensory Prayer Morning at All Saints Church



Children in Key Stage 2 recently visited church for a sensory visit. The children were given the opportunity to touch sand, rocks and water, taste dark chocolate followed by salted crisps and bread, they smelt frankincense and myrrh along with lavender, looked at pictures of creation and listen to Karl Jenkin's [Benedictus](#) [Karl Jenkins - Benedictus - YouTube](#) whilst either looking up to the roof of the church or with their eyes closed.

This allowed the children to have the chance to reflect on how their senses enabled them to think about the world around them along with short bible quotes. The children gained practical experiences of how

some Christians, and others, enjoy using their senses to reflect on their faith and beliefs. Many thanks to the volunteer adults who joined us, without your help the trip would not have taken place and thanks to Rev'd Sherine and Micki for welcoming us into church and organising the sense stations around the church for us all to experience.



Springs Dance Company visit



As an enrichment during Sports' Week, Years 1-6 enjoyed dance workshops from the Springs Dance Company. The Dancers invited the children to investigate the Parable of the Good Samaritan by using contemporary dance moves to represent the characters and sections of the story. This included working together, relying on each other and as the children grew in confidence trying more complicated movements and balances.

The 3 dancers who joined us had travelled from Cambridge, London and Wiltshire and were all impressed with how keenly the children had participated and expressed their

ideas of the story through their individual dances.



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Access

Parking



Whilst we appreciate the difficulties regarding the limited parking options, in order to keep the access to school clear for emergency vehicles, please **DO NOT park in the yellow boxed area**, outside the staff car park. Access to the staff car park is required **at all times**.

Please can we request parents/carers are considerate of where you are parking – the roundabout and grass verges should not be parked on. Thank you for your co-operation.

Dogs

Please be reminded that dogs cannot be brought onto school premises. We have been made aware that a couple have been carried in people's arms. Whilst we're sure the dogs are being properly supervised, we have children with allergies and anxiety. Dogs must be supervised outside of the school gates at drop off and collection times. Thank you for your cooperation.

Attendance and Punctuality

ATTENDANCE

Last term, our whole school attendance was 94.69%; our target is 97% (the national expectation). For our school to reach 97%, we need to ensure that children's time out of school is only for illness or **exceptional circumstances**.

Lateness also needs to be considered, as 'on time to school' really does matter; school doors open at 8.45am and **school learning begins at 8.55am**.

If you need to leave an absence message on the school answerphone, please can we remind parents/carers to leave a specific reason for absence i.e. give details if ill. To ensure the safety of all the children in school, we do need to know more than 'feeling unwell' or 'not very well'.

Thank you for your understanding.

Reminder:

Children must stay off school for 48 hours following any episode of vomiting or diarrhoea.

Breakfast Club


Please be reminded that due to increases in the cost of staffing and provisions, the cost of each session has now increased to £2.50 (children entitled to Free School Meals will not need to pay). **ALL** sessions must be booked in advance, regardless of whether they are chargeable or not.



Breakfast Club opens at 8.00am each day; breakfast is served between 8.00am-8.30am. Sessions must be booked in advance via Parentmail to guarantee your child's place. The booking system is available to book sessions 8 weeks in advance. Sessions close 4 days before the required day. If you would like to book, please book via +Pay (Accounts) on Parentmail.

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Willoughby Foods



Please remember to order your child's school meals before the order deadline (midnight on the Tuesday of the week before). If meals are not ordered in time, this creates additional work and if children do not have a lunch, we cannot always guarantee spare meals are available.

In the event of a sickness absence, school meals may be cancelled from **day 2** of the absence, and for subsequent days, provided we receive notification by telephone or e-mail by 8.30 a.m. on the first day of the absence.

Where you have notified us of your child's absence within the specified timescales, you will receive a credit for cancelled meals, if these are usually paid for.

Due to the hall being out of use on **Friday 23rd June** and **Thursday 6th July**, all school meals that day have been changed to a packed lunch option.

If you have already ordered meals for your child/children on those days, their lunch will be swapped to:

- Ham Sandwich, Crunchy Vegetable Sticks, Homemade Muffin & a piece of Fruit.

If a vegetarian meal was ordered, your child's meal will be swapped to:

- Cheese Sandwich, Crunchy Vegetable Sticks, Homemade Muffin & a piece of Fruit.
