


Meet William Stukeley's Team of Reading Ambassadors.






A brilliantly funny first guide to genetics that is perfect for children aged 5 years and over.

The extraordinary world of genetics has never been explained so simply. You'll be amazed at what makes you YOU!



In addition to what Cole has already said, it also gave those children the opportunity to read every day, which is so important for the development of early decoding and fluency skills.

Furthermore, the children can enjoy being read to. This has astonishing benefits for children: comfort and reassurance, confidence and security, relaxation, happiness and fun. Giving a child time and full attention when reading them a story tells them they matter. It builds self-esteem, vocabulary and feeds imagination.

Re-establishing Book Buddies was one of the first things that the Reading Rascals were keen to do. They have already begun to assemble a group of volunteers. If you would like to know more and get involved, ask one of the team.




