Principles

- We ensure that teaching and learning opportunities meet the needs of all of the pupils.
- We ensure that appropriate provision is made for pupils who belong to vulnerable groups, this includes ensuring that the needs of socially disadvantaged pupils are adequately assessed and addressed.
- In making provision for socially disadvantaged pupils, we recognise that not all pupils who receive free school meals will be socially disadvantaged.
- We also recognise that not all pupils who are socially disadvantaged are registered or qualify for free school meals. We reserve the right to allocate the Pupil Premium funding to support any pupil or groups of pupils the school has legitimately identified as being socially disadvantaged.
- Pupil Premium funding will be allocated following a needs analysis which will identify priority classes, groups or individuals. Limited resources means that not all children receiving free school meals will be in receipt of Pupil Premium interventions at one time.

Provision

- Providing small group work with adults to focus on overcoming gaps in learning.
- All our work through the Pupil Premium was aimed at accelerating progress - moving children to at least age related expectations. Initially this is in Literacy and Numeracy.

Impact

Key Stage 2 Test Results for 2013:

Percentage of pupils achieving Reading and Maths tests and Writing Teacher Assessment at Level 4 or above is 86%

Percentage of pupils achieving Reading and Maths tests at Level 4B or above and Writing Teacher Assessment at Level 4 is 81%.

Percentage of pupils making expected progress in Maths is 97%.

Percentage of pupils making expected progress in Reading is 89%.

Percentage of pupils making expected progress in Writing is 100%.

Percentage of Pupil Premium pupils making expected progress in Maths is 92%.

Percentage of Pupil Premium pupils making expected progress in Reading is 92%.

Percentage of Pupil Premium pupils making expected progress in Writing is 100%.

Key Stage 1 Results for 2013:

Percentage of pupils achieving Level 2b or above in
Reading 80%

Writing 73%

Maths 83%

69% pupils were successful in the Year 1 Screening Check.

2013 - 2014

For the academic year 2013 - 2014 the same principles will prevail.

Pupil progress meetings highlight where the 'need' is most required. Pupil premium will continue to fund active and successful additional adult support, it will allow effective 1:1 tuition, it will help to improve valuable feedback and implement intervention strategies.

It will help fund extra-curricular activities and part fund educational visits and the like.

It will part fund the new Breakfast Club (Oct 13) which will receive all pupils but there will be a focus on pupil premium children and an awareness that places for these children will be fully funded.
