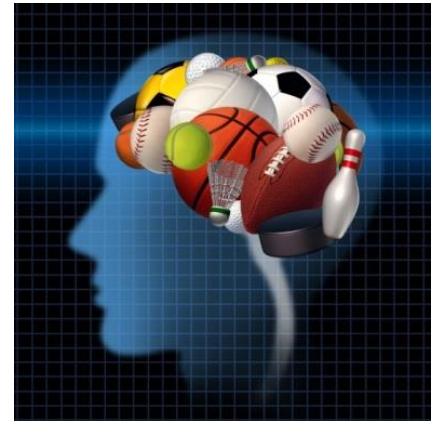


Sport Science

Research has found that on average, children begin to receive pocket money aged seven, own their first mobile phone at eight, and purchase items online at 10, with one in five having used their parents' or older siblings' credit or debit card to purchase these items.

They can open a bank account and have a debit card at 11. At 18 they can apply for a credit card or loan, and before they leave school, they have to make crucial decisions about jobs, student loans, and living independently.

The need for young people to be in control of their money has never been stronger.

So, if you want to find out how to manage your money, become a critical consumer, learn how to manage risks and emotions associated with money and understand the important role money plays in our lives, then come and join the **Money Matters** lectures.

Do you enjoy designing and creating things?

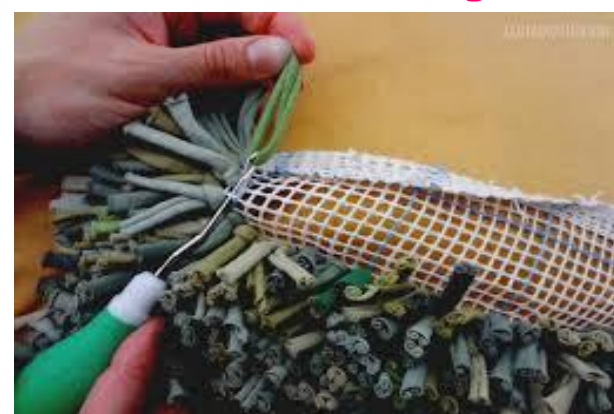
Do you have an interest in textiles and are you passionate about recycling? Maybe you are thinking of a career that involves both? If so, this could be the seminar for you!

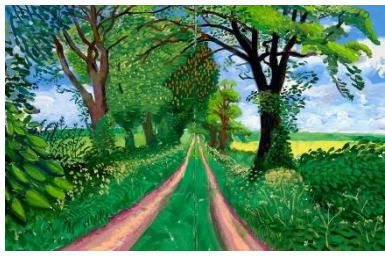
